

As of Monday 4 May, additional COVID-19 restrictions were lifted on the North West Coast

But what does this actually mean?



It means that North West Coasters have done an amazing job following the rules such that we are beginning to see the number of positive cases of COVID -19 decline and remain low. As a result, the additional safety measures that have been in place for North West residents have now been lifted.

This does NOT mean all other restrictions have been lifted.

It does mean that the North West coast is now back in line with the rest of Tasmania.

It does mean some non-essential retail business such as clothing and whitegoods stores are now able to re-open as well as hair dressers, bookstores, gift stores, and what is referred to as “big box’ retailers. **BUT** they reopen with strict social distancing measures in place.

All other Tasmanian restrictions remain in place.
